TESTS AND TEST PREPARATION**

Most U.S. schools require applicants to take standardized tests for admission. The tests required depend on the degree program. Visit the school's website to find out what tests it requires for admission. For more information on specific tests, including practice materials and registration instructions, visit the test's website. Study books, CDs, and practice tests for all tests are available at the American Cultural Center in Maputo and the American Corners in Beira (Universidade Pedagógica) and the American Reading Room in Nampula (UniLurio). If a test is not available in Mozambique, check for test dates in neighboring countries.

- TOEFL - Test of English as a Foreign Language. Required for undergraduate and graduate admission to most U.S. schools. Offered several times a month at the American Cultural Center Martin Luther King in Maputo and in neighboring countries. Test fee: \$195. Register at: www.ets.org/toefl.

- Undergraduate Exams: SAT or ACT – Required for undergraduate admission to most U.S. universities. Offered up to six times a year at the American International School in Maputo and in neighboring countries. SAT Test fee: \$98. ACT Test Fee: \$98. Register at www.sat.collegeboard.org (SAT) or www.actstudent.org (ACT).

- Graduate Exams: GRE, GMAT, MCAT, LSAT – Required for graduate admission to most degree programs, including in the humanities and social sciences, business, medicine, and law.
 - **GRE:** Graduate Record Exam. Required for most graduate degrees, with the exception of business, law, and medicine. Offered four times a year at the American Cultural Center in Maputo and in neighboring countries. Test Fee: \$205. Register at www.ets.org/gre. Some test preparation sites:

 - **GMAT:** Graduate Management Admissions Test. Required for graduate business school programs. Offered several times a month in Johannesburg, South Africa and other neighboring countries. Test Fee: \$250. Register at www.mba.com. Some test preparation sites:

 - **MCAT:** Medical College Admissions Test. Required for graduate programs in medicine. Offered seven times a year in Johannesburg, South Africa. Test Fee: \$365. Register at www.aamc.org/students/applying/mcat/. Some test preparation sites:

 - **LSAT:** Law School Admissions Test. The 3-year Juris Doctor (JD) degree is required to practice law in the United States. The 1-year Master of Laws (LLM) degree is considered an advanced law certification that has global credibility. Students must already have a Licenciatura in law for admission to either program. JD

- applicants must take the LSAT while LLM applicants must take the GRE. LSAT is offered four times a year in Johannesburg, South Africa. Test Fee: \$170. Register at www.lsac.org/jd. Some test preparation sites:
